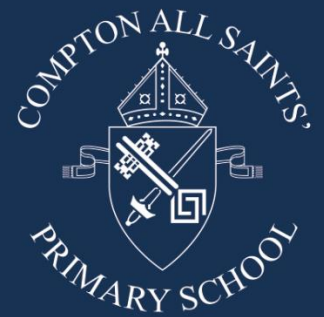

Ladybirds have made a bird hive in our Discovery area as we begin to think about the birds that we see in our locality. This links in with our text driver called Grandma Bird by Benji Davies. The children have been enjoying peeping out of the bird hive to see any birds flying over. They have clipboards and are recording what they see or what they wish they could see! I am not sure Discovery is really the quiet place that suits a bird hide but they are enjoying it anyway!



Hedgehogs Class started their 'Ship Ahoy' topic. We were meant to have a visitor on Monday but they never turned up... However, a pirate came and ransacked our classroom instead! They did leave behind some treasure for us though. We have also been using our compasses to follow directions to treasure this week. Ladybird year ones have made an amazing start to Hedgehogs in the afternoon and it is like they have always been there!

Foxes have started their new topic "Road Trip" by using their own "passports" to virtually travel to different North American cities to find out interesting facts and key information about each place. They loved looking at the departure lounge to find out which location they were travelling to next!



Owls class have started a new topic this week of "do the eyes have it" which is a study of how the powers of the monarchy has changed since 1066. As part of this the children explored electric circuits on Monday and were able to record these using scientific symbols. This links into our ICT topic of Microbits. The children reminded themselves of how they work and created some different patterns on them and different tunes.
