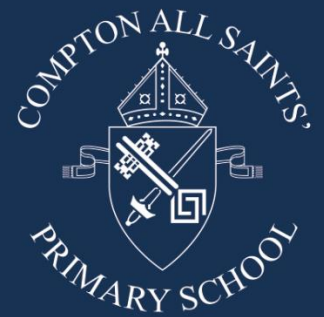

CSA: Thank you to everyone who came to support the quiz night last week. We raised over £300 for the school. These funds will go towards subsidising Christmas Trips and workshops in the school.

Donations: Thank you everyone for their Harvest Donations! Eastleigh food bank were very grateful and had over seven crates in total. Equally, thank you to everyone who has provided shoe boxes for the rotary club, nearly 40 boxes were collected today. This is a wonderful initiative and it is lovely to see the children bringing them in all decorated and taking pride in their contribution.

Survey Response – thank you for completing the survey this month. We had 45 responses which is a fantastic return. There were some real strengths that came through from the feedback. 93% of parents either agree or strongly agree that their child is happy at the school. 100% of parents agree or strongly agree that their child feels safe, and 100% of parents either agree or strongly agree that they feel actively part of our school. Some areas were highlighted that I will explore further. 12% of parents feel communication is not effective, 18% feel they do not know how their child is progressing and 27% disagreed we had a good range of extra curricula activities. I will explore each of these areas in the coming weeks. Thank you again for your overwhelmingly positive comments.

This is due to the level of **violence** in the game but equally due to the **online-chat features** and concerns around **screen time**. We are hearing reports and conversations of children **arguing** over the chat feature and this spilling over into **school time**. We are aware of children getting emotionally upset after playing the game – leading to behaviour challenges as well as friendship issues.
